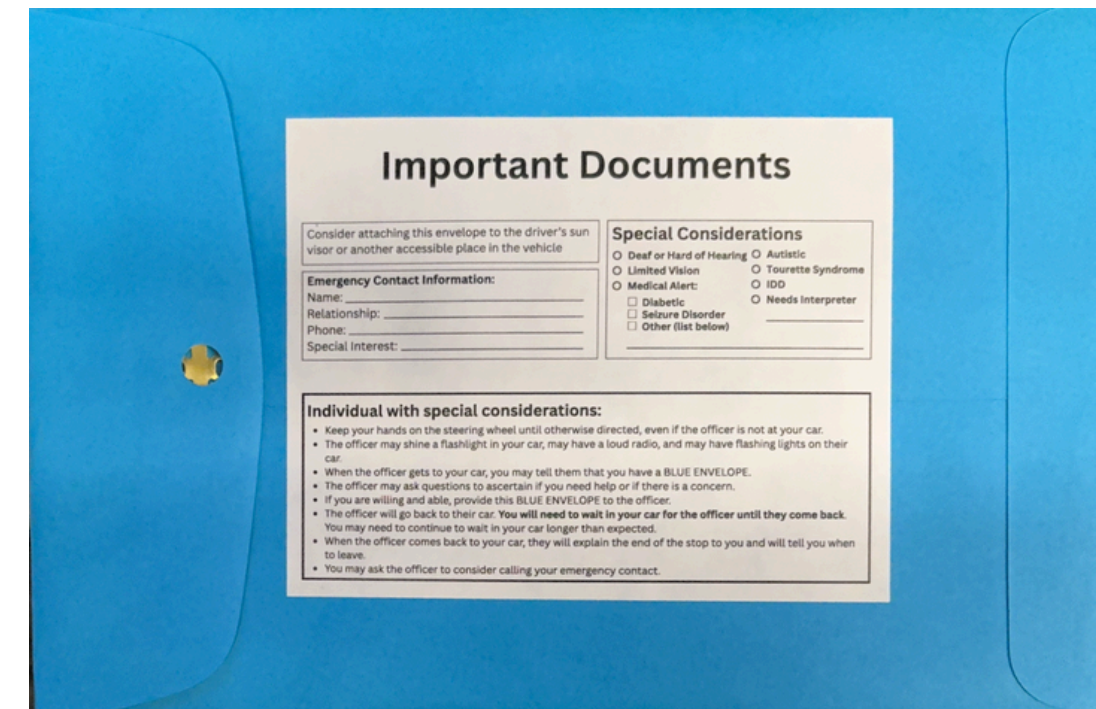
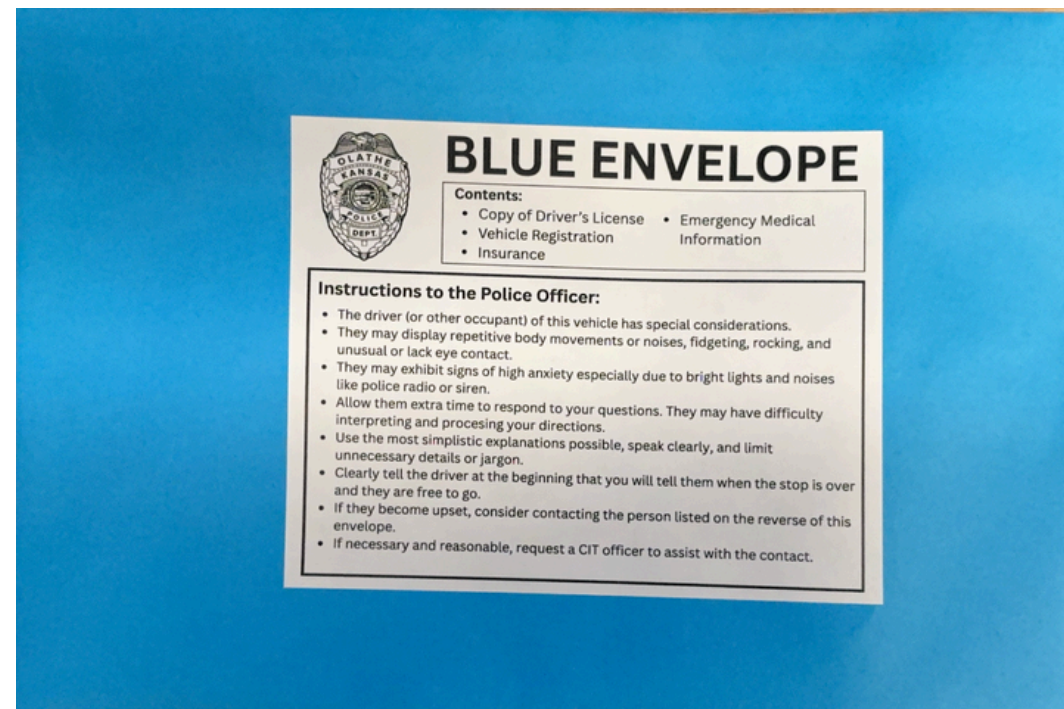
Olathe Partnership for Inter-Organizational Navigation and Solutions

- Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities
- Severe and Persistent Mental Illness

Problem-solving with community partners the most effective solution for the client to minimize contacts with emergency services

BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM



- Assist law enforcement when communicating with someone with special considerations
- Holds all information necessary for a traffic stop
- Any other valuable information to minimize verbal or visual contact
- Directions for both LEO and person on how to interact

911 CHECKLIST

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM
911 CHECKLIST

If your family member is in crisis and is a danger to themselves or others
CALL 911
Provide the following information:

- Your Name
- Address where the police should respond
- Nature of the crisis (why you need the police)
- Prior or current violent behavior
- Weapons or access to weapons
- Name of your family member in crisis
- Age of family member
- Height and Weight of family member
- Clothing description of family member
- Current location of family member
- Diagnosis (mental health and other)
- Current medications (on or off)
- Drug use (current or past)
- Triggers (what upsets them)
- What has helped during previous police contacts?
- Identify other persons at the location

IMPORTANT: You are asking a stranger to come into your home to resolve a crisis situation. They will only have the information that you provide to them. It is good practice to gather as much of this information as possible before a crisis occurs.

If your family member is in crisis and is a danger to themselves or others
CALL 911
Provide the following information:

- Name
- Address
- Nature of the Crisis
- Prior/current violent behavior
- Weapons or access to them
- Name, Age, Height, Weight
- Clothing
- Current Location
- Diagnosis
- Current Meds
- Drug Use
- Triggers
- What has helped in the past
- Who all else is in the home

TAKE ME HOME PROGRAM

- Database maintained by JOCO Sheriff's Office and only accessible to law enforcement
- When an officer encounters a person alone, or reported missing, the officer has access to the database to more quickly assist the person
- Includes a pic, disability, description, and emergency contact info
