Community Health Workers

- The Johnson County Department of Health & Environment Community Health Worker (CHW) program is a free resource that helps clients learn to navigate applications for Kansas Medicaid, Presumptive Eligibility and SNAP, as well as connect to various community resources.
- Clients who participate in the CHW program will meet regularly with a certified CHW to identify goals, work toward goal attainment and gain the knowledge and confidence to navigate resources and systems independently.
- Community Health Workers are trusted members of the communities they serve who have a deep understanding of health systems, barriers to health and healthcare access and community resources.

IRIS Integrated Referral and Intake System

IRIS (Integrated Referral & Intake System) is a web-based community referral system developed by the University of Kansas Center for Public Partnerships and Research (KU-CPPR). IRIS is a communication tool to support best practices in social service referral and coordination among community partners. Its primary purpose is to enable service providers in a community to make, receive, track, and respond to referrals.



IRIS Successes



- Creation: The KC Metro IRIS community was formed by merging three local IRIS communities in March of 2022.
- Geographic Area: The Kansas City Metro IRIS Community represents 10 counties in the KC Metro are: Johnson, Wyandotte, Franklin, Miami and Leavenworth on the Kansas side and Jackson, Cass, Clay, Lafayette and Platte on the Missouri side.
- **Cost:** The annual cost of \$10,000 is paid equally by Jackson County Public Health, Johnson County Department of Health and Environment and Health Coalition of Wyandotte County. IRIS is free to join for all partners.
- **Impact:** Since March 2022, approximately 5,600 families have been served with 9,500 referrals. Of those referrals, nearly 60 percent had their needs met.
- Engagement: There are currently 223 active IRIS partners.
- Accountability: Each organization commits to following our Community Standards regarding expectations, engagement and coordination of services.

- The capacity bar helps organizations share with the community their ability to serve as well as notify the community of waitlists or other barriers to services.
- Regular community check-ins, resources lunch and learns, and monthly newsletters keep our community connected and in touch with each other!
- IRIS can adapt to changing situations and needs. This flexibility allows for creativity in using IRIS to meet the needs of the community no matter the situation.
- IRIS leadership are community members who are dedicated to the communities where we live work and play. Having local leadership means having valuable knowledge of the needs of the community and resources available. Community connection is key!
