started rehabilitation at a hospital prior to entering Long Term Care Rehabilitation. This individual originally accessed			
Brain Injury (BI) HCBS waiver services and currently Physical Disability (PD) HCBS waiver services. The individual moves			

slowly and has some physical deficits following the accident. He has significant short term memory deficits. Previously, the individual and his mother/Guardian struggled to ensure Personal Care Services (PCS) were available in his apartment home to meet his needs. The member suffered from depression partly due to lack of much socialization. Typically, he had only 1 personal care services worker. He was mostly sitting in a chair by himself with the PCS worker "doing for him", per his mother. Through a pilot project the individual receives services for day and residential supports from an IDD provider using a combination of video monitoring and communications, in person Day services, home delivered meals, and personal care services. The individual has experienced a reduction in depression due to this service model that has incorporated many opportunities for socialization and personal control. His Guardian reports he feels much more independent and in control of his life as he does not have a worker "in his space" at all times.
