NFMH Agreement Summary

Pre-Settlement Agreement Overview

- Signed agreement July 1, 2021
- Runs through 2029; most practice improvements only over a five-year period
- Parties:
 - KDADS and KDHE
 - Topeka Independent Living Center through their Counsel (Disability Rights Center of Kansas - DRC)
 - Center for Public Representation
 - AARP Foundation Legal
 - Shook, Hardy & Bacon
 - Individuals with mental illness living in NFMHs as constituents of DRC

Practice Improvement Areas

- 1. NFMH residents receive specialized services
- 2. CARE/PASRR, New Informed Choice trainings
- 3. Community Transitions
- 4. Supported Housing, Housing First Pathways
- 5. Supported Employment / IPS
- 6. Case Management Contract
- 7. Certified Peer Services
- 8. Certified Community Behavior Health Clinics (CCBHC); Assertive Community Treatment (ACT); Mobile Crisis Services

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NFMH Agreement Summary

Outcomes

- 1. Referrals to and admissions of the at-risk population to NFMHs will be reduced by 10% for each of the next 5 years
- 2. Number of residents with average length of stay more than six months will decrease (200 over five years)
- 3. Number of residents discharged and remaining in the community for at least a year will increase by 20% for each of the next 5 years



KDADS Settlement Agreement

A Partnership between NFMHs & CMHC/CCBHCs

NFMH Settlement Agreement Goal Work collaboratively to achieve transition of NFMH residents into integrated community settings with appropriate services:

- Giving residents in the NFMHs and those at risk of entry the opportunity to live more independent lives
- Increasing access to behavioral healthcare services
- Enhancing existing housing supports and treatment services

Informed Choice

What does Informed Choice mean?

Informed choice is the process of choosing from options based on accurate information, knowledge, and experiences. Informed Choice practice principles include:

- Everyone is capable of making choices
- Choice means knowing what options are available
- Choices have consequences
- Choices are made within the context of cultural and societal expectations
- Some choices are viewed as more acceptable than others

Why is Informed Choice Practice important for community integration?

- It involves the individual in the decision-making process
- It helps them to develop their own capabilities
- Individuals are more likely to stick to treatment plans
- It motivates individuals to adopt positive health behaviors

A Person-Centered Plan should help to:

- Live in the least restrictive, most inclusive setting for the individual's needs
- Transition to the community as soon as practical
- Have a clear care plan
- Attain and maintain a strong quality of life



Person-Centered Planning

What do you want for your future?

- What are <u>your</u> hopes and dreams
- What goals do you have for your life
- Make your <u>own</u> choices in your daily life
- Have <u>opportunities</u> to spend time with friends
- Be <u>involved</u> with community activities
- Have <u>easy access</u> to needed health services

Specialized Services

Specialized services supporting residents of NFMHs

- The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) secured additional money in State General Funds (SGF) to support CMHCs with NFMHs in their service area in the provision of specialized services to the residents of the local NFMH.
- Until the KDADS case management contractor is in place, CMHC NFMH Liaisons will
 work directly with the NFMH staff as designated by the NFMH Administrator to
 identify the NFMH residents to first receive the SGF specialized services.
- After the KDADS case management contractor is in place in SFY2023 (July 1, 2022 June 30, 2023), the CMHC NFMH Liaisons will work with the KDADS case management contractor and NFMH staff to expand specialized services to more NFMH residents.
